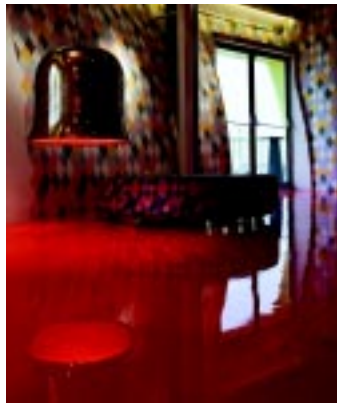


## 金碧辉煌的荷兰餐厅 **Gold, Neon Oh My!**

Called "Happy Street", the VIP Lounge and Restaurant is an exaggeration of form and color. With gold porcelain, neon and diamonds, this may sound precariously gaudy, but the entire scheme is amusingly tasteful and witty. From the Imperial Yellow flooring to the diamond-shaped lights made out of Jingdezhen porcelain, the Happy Street is certainly guaranteed to make even the most dour, happy. ★

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
